BOUNDARY ROADS

- ➤ 14th Avenue West, south of SE 1-45-7-W4, from the west boundary to 1st Street;
- ➤ 14 Street, from 23rd Avenue to the north boundary of L.9 B.2 P.002 4768.

STORM WATER / UTILITY SERVICES

- A Storm Water Management plan will be the responsibility of each landowner. The MD and the Town will not be held responsible or liable for any affects caused by storm water runoff. At the time of development permits being issued or application to subdivide, it will be the responsibility of the Town to acquire the proper documents to ensure that all regulations are being adhered to. Applicants and landowners will follow the Town's Municipal Development Standards.
- ➤ All permit applications, change of use, and/or subdivisions will adhere to the bylaws and policies set in place by the Town.
- The annexed lands will not be forced to attach to the Town's utility services, unless mutually agreed upon between the landowner and the Town. The existing services will be accepted by the Town along with any current developments that do not conform to any of the Town's bylaws or policies. Once a development permit is approved, change of use or subdivision occurs on a particular parcel of land, the owner will adhere to all current bylaws and policies set out by the Town at that time, including utility servicing.
