



# PREDATOR REDUCTION INCENTIVE PROGRAM



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Who can participate in the program?

- M.D. of Wainwright landowners or those renting land in the M.D. (rural and hamlet residents). Proof of land rental may be required to verify eligibility.
- **One person per rural address** may participate in this program. If you are an M.D. landowner but do not have a blue sign, please contact ASD.
- Those residing in the Town of Wainwright, Villages of Irma, Edgerton or Chauvin, or outside of the M.D. of Wainwright are not eligible.

### How to make an appointment/where to bring carcasses?

- Carcasses will be viewed by **appointment only** during regular business hours (8:30am-12:00pm, 1:00pm-4:30pm).
  - Note that ASD Staff are **not** in the office daily.
- Contact Agricultural Services at 780-842-4454 or by emailing [asbprograms@mdwainwright.ca](mailto:asbprograms@mdwainwright.ca) to make an appointment.
- Carcasses must be brought **covered** to the M.D. of Wainwright Admin Building at 717 14<sup>th</sup> Ave Wainwright, AB.
- Carcasses will be inspected outdoors only.

### How much is paid per carcass?

- \$20.00 per coyote.
- \$150.00 per wolf.

### How is payment received?

- Participants should complete an Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) Authorization Form and the Predator Reduction Incentive Program Application Form to receive payment.
- ASD will submit all verified applications for payment processing following program conclusion. A single lump payment will be issued in mid May at the first available opportunity.
- No payments will be issued on the spot.

### What is the limit per participant?

- **Maximum 12** animals per eligible participant for the program term.

### Do I bring the whole carcass, skinned, a foot or tail?

- Only whole, fresh carcasses are accepted.
- Partial carcasses (skinned, foot, or tail only), or those appearing improperly harvested (ie snared) will not be accepted.

### What is the identification mark?

- The foot of coyote carcasses will be spray painted at the time of inspection. Wolves will be photographed.

### Who is responsible for disposing of the carcass?

- The participant presenting the carcass is responsible for safe and proper disposal. The Municipality does not provide carcass disposal.

### Do I need to register or have any permits?

- No registration or permit is required. Participants must abide by all applicable provincial legislation and hunting regulations.

### When does the program end?

- April 30<sup>th</sup> or until the budget is exhausted, whichever comes first. The program will run on a first come, first served basis, and participants are advised to confirm there is available budget for claims.
