- Information: Introduced from Europe, weed of moist pastures.
- · Life cycle: Perennial.
- Root: Hairy, fibrous, occasionally rhizomatous.
- Leaves: Hairy leaves deeply lobed (nearly to the base) into three to five segments with each segment lobed again; leaves decrease in size toward stem apex; uppermost leaves have three to four narrow segments.
- Stems: Up to 100cm tall, branched and hairy.
- Flower: Glossy yellow flowers in clusters, up to 3cm in diameter with greenish center.
- **Seed/Fruit:** Disc-shaped, reddish brown with short hook.
- **Toxic:** Horses, cattle, sheep, goats
- · Control: Chemical.
