

## Prohibited Noxious

- · Life cycle: Perennial.
- **Root:** Taproot and lateral roots.
- Leaves: Oval-shaped leaves up to 2.5cm long, opposite, lack stalks and teeth, are darker green above, and have in-rolled edges and tiny transparent dots on the surface.
- •Stems: 30-90cm tall, reddish with black glands, erect, with two opposite longitudinal ridges; may branch many times near the top.
- Flower: Numerous five-petaled yellow flowers form flat-topped clusters on terminal branches. Flowers are up to 2.5cm in diameter and bloom from the center out. Black glands along the petal margins.
- Seed/Fruit: Rust colored seeds pods are 5mm long and contain numerous seeds in three-pointed capsules.
- **Toxic:** Horses, cattle, sheep.
